
Athabasca River Ramblers







So far, winter has been fairly mild. It's been wonderful to be able to take walks outside and get some exercise. If we can't dance for now, we can at least keep moving any way we can.


We hope everyone remains well, both physically and emotionally. Reach out when you need to. And we hope to see everyone again in the not too distant future!
