

Often whistling while he worked, Len was known as a go-to neighbour who was always willing to help others. Len never sat still and didn't want anyone else to either!

Len and Doreen loved to square dance and made many friends from around Alberta and the US, meeting many friends on the dance floor. They danced with the Whirlaways for many years. They were always busy hosting dinners, square dance camp outs & family reunions. After Doreen passed, he married Sheila and they danced at the Sandholm Crossroad Dancers.

Stephen started square dancing in September of 2004. By the time he had completed his second year of dancing, he and his wife became President couple. He served for a few years at that time and agreed to be President again (often) whenever the position was open. He was an "idea" person always looking for new and better ways to meet the purposes of the Country Sunshiners and other organizations he served. His computer skills were greatly appreciated by other executive members. He had a great sense of humour and loved to joke with people. He enjoyed dancing with the new dancers and was very sad when the cancer journey forced him to give that up.

Stephen also supported the umbrella association of square dancing. It was called EDSDA when he first agreed to be on the executive and later CDCDA. He served that organization as the first Administrative Assistant and worked in the office above Big Red Accounting.

Stephen has always been an active volunteer, much of it through his church. He served as President of Edmonton Central Council – the administrative body for Society of Saint Vincent de Paul (SSVP). He went on missions to Jamaica and also to Kenya to work with less fortunate folks and was passionate about the food hampers SSVP provided locally.

Stephen leaves to mourn his death, his wife Carman (nee McGhan), her children Kirsty MacGregor, Robin (Rob) McFadyen and Rosalie(Gordon) Hardcastle, his brothers Lance Dufresne and Keith (Delberta) Dufresne, nieces, nephews, grandchildren, great grandchildren and his many friends, especially those in the square dance world, the Knights of Columbus, and the SSVP organization. she worked on some different jobs until she could talk and understand the English language better.


She got a job with the City of Edmonton in accounting where she worked until 1999.






