Memories of Edmonton Singles Square Dance Club

In the fall of 1977, I joined the Edmonton Singles Square Dance Club and it literally changed my life. (The club had started the previous year and was looking for dancers.)

At that time, I was very, very shy and avoided talking to anyone, especially the opposite sex.

After travelling across the city, I still remember how close I was to changing my mind.

I remember standing on the sidewalk outside Mayfield School and was about ready to leave when someone asked me: "Are you coming in?"

Luckily, I went in and discovered the wonderful world of Square Dancing. I soon realized that I knew what I was doing on the Square Dance floor and my confidence level improved. I found square dancing relatively easy, very enjoyable and I am grateful for the opportunities this presented. I enjoyed my newfound activity so much that I started promoting it immediately.

I encouraged many social dancers to try Square Dancing (personally recruiting as many as 20 in one year).

I had previously joined the Single Parents Club and was running the bar. I would occasionally dance with a lady, but I found it extremely difficult due to my lack of confidence. It was much easier to stay behind the bar!!

In the spring of 1978, the Edmonton Singles Square Dance Club elected a new board to take over in September, and I was elected Vice President. Unfortunately, when the new season started only 2 of us were left to run the club. Part of my duties as VP was making announcements. Due to my supreme shyness, I was not able to talk in front of a group, so I had asked the caller to cover for me.

Our 1st caller couple was Wally & Iris Ewen. When Wally decided to resign, we hired a young caller by the name of Tommy Dakers. The problem was: Tommy did not have a car. It was my job to transport him & his equipment to and from the dance every week. We continued to hire various callers (too numerous to name).

In the fall of 1978, I started Round Dancing, and I found it very difficult. It certainly was not easy like Square Dancing, but I persisted and eventually I started to get the hang of it. I encouraged my fellow Square Dancers to come Round Dancing on the understanding we would only dance with other singles.

By the fall of 1982 I was starting to understand this activity - Round Dancing, and I was often helping fellow dancers during the breaks. After all I was an "expert" at identifying the difficulties.

The instructor (Gary Brown) noticed me helping the other dancers, during the breaks. He handed me a round dance record and said, "practice". With Gary's encouragement I helped him teach the class the rest of the year.

My fellow Square Dancers / Round Dancers wanted more practice and asked me to help. We started practicing in my rumpus room and the Edmonton Singles Round Dance Club was founded - later renamed Red's Rounders.

I continued to teach Round Dancing for 30 years with emphasis on new dancers. Thank you to Edmonton Singles Square Dance Club for giving me the confidence.

Each week after the square dance, a group of square dancers would meet at Norwood Legion.

A young lady named Evelyn Oracheski was part of the group. She had started square dancing in 1983 attending the dances with a friend. The girl-friend often left after the square dance, and Evelyn needed a ride to Sherwood Park. Naturally "I stepped up to the plate".

Yes, I was still super shy, but when Evelyn asked me to escort her to a friend 's wedding I said "Yes" and we started dating in 1985.

We were married on July 24, 1987; and we planned to honeymoon at the annual square dance Jamboree in Penticton. A week later we headed to Penticton, just as the tornado hit Edmonton.

At the Penticton Jamboree I cued my first round dance on the stage with 200 dancers depending on me to cue it right. Yes, I was scared but somehow, I managed to get all the butterflies "flying in formation". (That was the 1st year the dancers voted to have the dances cued, instead of memorizing.)

I have often reflected on all the accomplishments made possible from this humble beginning. In spite of being shy, I have managed "to come out of my shell" and tackle many tasks that at one time seemed to be impossible.



Fifty Years of Square Dancing

Bob and Ethel started dancing in the fall of 1963 at Nipawin Saskatchewan. The Caller Couple was Eddie and Irene Lindman with the Nipawin Swing"n Gingham. In the spring of 1964 the club was having what they called a Goffers Night. Eddie encouraged Bob to take a record and learn it. So he did learn "Alabama Jubilee". In the fall of 1964 Bob found a group of young people interested in learning to Square dance. We also attended the New dancer group to help his learning. In January 1965 the club at Choiceland, Saskatchewan had their caller move away and they came to Bob and asked him to call for them. The Club had a number of years of dancing and he was a new caller but he took it on. It was a real experience for him but they were satisfied. In the spring of 1966 the 4H Light Horse Club became interested in doing Square Dancing on horse back. Another new experience for everyone. In the Summer of 1967 we took 50 kids and 52 horses into Saskatoon Pioneer Days to do 3 afternoon matinees and 3 evening shows. A great time was had. Over the first years of Square dancing we travelled mostly with three other couples. At that time we could go up to seven nights a week with in a short distance. The young people had a good number of Dancers; some joined in with the Adult group.

In the fall of 1967 we made our move to Yellowknife, NWT, a whole new experience. We arrived only to find a small group of dancers dancing to singing calls so we offered to teach the basics. Next we knew we had started the Ptarmigan Twirlers, a great way to meet people when you move to a new community. Our fourteen years in the north saw many things go on. We saw three more clubs start in the NWT, Hay River, Pine Point and Fort Smith. We made many visits to them all and lots of great times was had. We attended Banff School of fine Arts starting in 1969 which was a great weeklong Square and Round Dance education. Thanks to Irene and Mickey Donnelly for being our guardians and setting us up with Dot and Wilf Willadall who transported us to Banff and back to Calgary our first year. Some other very special things to us was when we brought in the Charters from Edmonton to attend our NWT Square Dance Conventions. We also made a couple of trips to Whitehorse Yukon by plane loaded with dancers from the NWT for a great weekend of fun and fellowship. Bob also had a half hour Square Dance program for 11 years at CBC North, another great experience. Many trips were made to Edmonton for Parkallen Frosty Frolic, Calgary Stampede, and a great opportunity to call with the late Jim Hopkins at Holiday Ranch and many years for Rocky Whirlaways summer campout.

In the spring of 1981 we moved from Yellowknife to take up our dream of farming. We called for many clubs throughout Alberta. We are still dancing with the Boyle Twilight Twirlers and teach Rounds and help with the dance program. We had the privilege to work with the late Bob McMillian for a Callers School and at many Conventions. This season ends our 50 Years of dancing and we are still able to have a Great Time.

Bob is survived by his loving wife Ethel of 63 years, 2 daughters: Gail (Peter) McQueen and Kathy Meszaros of Yellowknife, 8 grandchildren, 8 great grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by son Cyril, 2 brothers Bill and Albert, and sister Peggy McGonigle.


When all six of them started square dancing, they took yearly trips to Penticton for the Square Dance Jamboree held there every August. This was a lot of fun for the entire family!

George Charles MARRINIER



Roger and Evelyn's volunteering efforts at SEESA were extensive and greatly appreciated.

Evelyn was awarded the Alberta Rose award in 2011 for her contribution to the square and round dance community.

She passed suddenly on February 16, 2023 after being diagnosed with pancreatic cancer.





The loss of our caller, Bob Fyfe, has severely impacted our club and the square dance community. Sincere condolences to Ethel and her families.






